

*Listen to the audio file and write your answers on rough paper or on an application like Microsoft Word.*

1. Listen to these 5 responses in Kristang. For each response, write a question that would lead to that response.

**EXAMPLE** Step 1. You hear the response: “I am Kevin.” in Kristang.  
Step 2. You write the question: “Who are you?” in Kristang.

**CHALLENGE** *Responses 4 and 5 are more difficult than the first 3 responses.*

2. Listen to these 10 people say (i) their names in Kristang and (ii) the language they speak. For each person, write out who they are and the language they speak in complete sentences in Kristang. Write all your numbers in word form instead of in number form (e.g. instead of ‘1’, you should write ‘one’).

**EXAMPLE** Step 1. You hear the first person say “Hello. I am Kevin. I speak English.” in Kristang.  
Step 2. You write “This is Kevin. Kevin is person one. He speaks English.” in Kristang.  
Step 3. You hear the second person say “Hello. I am Lisa. I speak Chinese.” in Kristang.  
Step 4. You write “This is Lisa. Lisa is person two. Lisa speaks Chinese.” in Kristang.

**CHALLENGE** *Replace “this” with either “that”, “this person is” or “that person is” in your sentence in Kristang.*

**3. Pre-Learning for Lesson 2 (CHALLENGE):** In both English and Kristang, we can say either “I am Kevin.” or “My name is Kevin.” to introduce ourselves. Listen to and write out the translations for the following sentences in Kristang:

**a.** My name is Fuad **b.** Her name is Frances **c.** Andre’s name is Andre **d.** This is Luis’s laptop **e.** That is Kevin’s book

Based on your translations, write down what you think the meaning of the word *sa* is.
